





cold. Each year, an average of more than 200,000, people in the U.S. are hospitalized from the flu, and nearly 3,600 people die as a result. SEARHC and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommend that individuals six months of age and older receive a flu vaccine. It is especially important if you are at higher risk for developing complications from the flu due to preexisting medical conditions. Others at greater risk for complications from influenza virus are pregnant women, children younger under five, people 65 and over as well as Alaska Natives and Native Americans, A flu vaccination does not guarantee protection against the flu. However, it is the first and most important step in protecting against the virus and its potentially serious complications. SEARHC has a supply of the vaccine at each of our clinics. Open enrollment for the Health Insurance Marketplace began Nov 1 and ends Jan 31, 2017. This year, Moda Health will not be available in Alaska so those insured by that company will need to move to a Premera Blue Cross plan. "Many people are nervous that they will not be able to afford a Marketplace plan because the Premera Blue Cross plans were more expensive last

year," said Andrea Thomas, SEARHC Outreach and Enrollment Manager. "The good news is that the assistance from the federal government (premium tax credit) will go up and the majority of people will still be eligible for an affordable plan." Additionally, grandfathered plans in Alaska will be ending this year. Grandfathered plans had been exempt from many changes required under the Affordable Care Act for a limited amount of time. Alaskans with one of these plans must switch to other health coverage during this open enrollment period to remain covered in 2017. People losing their insurance and those currently without health insurance will be able to purchase health coverage during open enrollment. People applying on the Health Insurance Marketplace may be eligible to receive assistance lowering monthly premiums, co-pays, and deductibles, depending on income, age, and family size. There are three ways to sign up or renew: online at www.healthcare.gov (the official website); call the Health Insurance Marketplace at 1-800-318- 2596, 24 hours a day, seven days a week. 

Blue Lake Road and Green Lake Road Closure Update -- Repairs to the Blue Lake Road and Green Lake Road are taking longer than anticipated and thus the roads will remain closed to ALL public access (pedestrian, bicycle, and vehicular traffic). When the public stays out of the way of our contractor our community costs for this project remain low. Our best estimate of the re-openings are as follows: Green Lake Road is expected to reopen to public pedestrian access by Dec 5. Blue Lake Road is expected to reopen to pedestrian access by Dec 14. These Extensive Road Repairs are being primarily funded by the Dept of Homeland Security and Emergency Management as repairs from the 2015 Landslide. These repairs will allow the Electric Department to complete the dam overlook project which will lead to a re-opening of public vehicle access to Blue Lake sometime next summer. This closure is meant to ensure the safety of the public while large construction equipment is working. Again, this closure applies 7 days a week and to all pedestrian traffic including bicycles. 


