

Regular Assembly Meetings are held the 2nd and 4th Tuesday of each month at 6:00 p.m. in Harrigan Centennial Hall.

Public comment on agenda items is encouraged and welcomed.

While in-person testimony will be taken during regular and special meetings, citizens are encouraged to provide comment by telephone. This is in an effort to comply with State COVID-19 Health Mandates regarding physical distancing and group gatherings.

To sign up for telephonic testimony, call the Municipal Clerk's Office at 747-1826 or email clerk@cityofsitka.org prior to 4pm the day of the meeting and specify the item you wish to testify on. Staff will do its best to accommodate requests received after 4pm and requests received during the meeting; however, while the meeting is in progress, no guarantees can be made. For discussion/direction/decision items, citizens are encouraged to sign up for telephonic testimony in order to have the opportunity to comment if a formal motion is made.

Ferry System

Summer Schedule:

AMHS released an updated Summer Schedule to provide an appropriate level of service based on passenger demand, crew availability, and state and federal guidelines for responding to the COVID-19 pandemic. The schedule is tentative and could change based on the ability and desire of Alaskans to travel given

the current COVID-19 situation. AMHS travelers must follow all applicable health mandates. The M/V Tustumena is scheduled to resume Southwest Alaska service on June 2 and will run its Aleutian Chain route once a month. The M/V Kennicott is tentatively scheduled to resume service on June 25 with a voyage from Ketchikan, to Bellingham, WA. However, interstate ferry service will be subject to State of Alaska and State of Washington travel rules in place at that time. Kennicott is scheduled to make cross-gulf trips and to visit Prince William Sound communities every other week. The M/V LeConte is scheduled to reenter service on June 17. LeConte will serve







Reopen Alaska Responsibly Phase 3/4 Info

Governor Dunleavy Announces Phases 3 and 4 of Re-opening Alaska to take effect Friday, May 22. During his news conference last night, the Governor announced that on Friday:

- · All businesses can open
- · All houses of worship can open
- Libraries and museums can open
- All sports activities can open



The following exceptions remain:

- 14-day quarantine for interstate and international travel to Alaska remains in place. This will be reevaluated by June 2, 2020 but will be reviewed weekly.
- · All senior centers, prisons, and institutions will continue to have re-
- · Any proposed large public gatherings such as festivals and concerts need to consult first with public health before scheduling.
- The State will continue to work with large industries to protect their workforce and the communities in which they operate.
- · Communities may still elect to keep in place travel restrictions.
- · Some Alaskan communities may wish to extend restrictions on non-essential travel into their communities for health reasons. Check with your local community.
- Health Mandates 15 (Elective Medical/Dental), 17 (Commercial Fishing), and 18 (Intrastate Travel) remain in effect.

While out of state travel restrictions have not been lifted, the Governor noted that his administration is working with the Alaska Air Carrier's Association to discuss how to safely restore travel to/from Alaska.

General guidelines are available on the state's website, with detailed guidance expected to be posted on May 21.
